

# FY 2016 UPDATE

#### **BY THE NUMBERS**

- 68 homes built, 81 families served
- Our annual tithe has built 80 homes around the world
- 278 volunteers contributed 10,804 hours helping with construction, ReStore, and office tasks
- 140 individuals, businesses, and organizations contributed \$286,455 in funds, goods, and services
- Our two ReStores, opened in April 2008 and August 2014, have combined gross sales of over 5 million dollars
- ReStore net profits continue to pay 100% of our overhead and administrative costs
- Over \$275,000 saved by Habitat homeowners through BVHfH interest-free mortgage loans has been invested in businesses, services, and savings in our community

## COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

- West Ada School District high school students completed their 16<sup>th</sup> BVHfH house
- Cathedral of the Rockies sponsored two Frazier Place homes
- Many national and local foundations granted funds for construction: Bank of America, Citi Cards, Citi Foundation, Kissler Family Foundation, Lightfoot Foundation, Thrivent Financial, US Bancorp, and Wells Fargo Housing Foundation
- These businesses contributed over \$5,000 in funds and inkind support: 1<sup>st</sup> Choice Cabinetry, Ashley Glass Company, Best Bath Systems, Franklin Building Supply, Lea Electric, The Turf Company, and Whirlpool Corporation
- FarWest Landscape & Garden Center organized and hosted their 10th annual fundraiser for BVHfH, raising over \$18,000





## MISSION STATEMENT

Boise Valley Habitat for Humanity (BVHfH) works in partnership with God and our community to provide decent affordable homes and to promote responsible homeownership for people in need.

We work with families in Ada County earning 30 – 50% of Area Median Income in need of decent, affordable housing. Families selected to participate in our program live in substandard housing, have a stable income, can qualify for a Habitat mortgage, and are willing to complete a requirement of 500 partnership hours, which includes helping construct their own homes.

Building costs are kept low through volunteer labor and financial and in-kind support for obtaining land and materials. Homes are sold to qualified families at no profit and BVHfH carries the zero-interest mortgage. Our building standards assure that we meet or exceed Energy Star standards and use low-VOC materials so that each home provides a healthy environment, is efficient, and has minimal impact on the environment.

## FRAZIER PLACE

Frazier Place was officially completed on September 15, 2016 with the closing of the final home in "Boise's Newest Neighborhood". This 10-year development was made possible by a partnership with the City of Boise, the financial support of numerous foundations and individuals, and approximately 35,000 volunteer hours. Our community came together to build simple decent, and affordable homes for fifteen hard-working Idaho families. We are proud of this accomplishment and all those that contributed so generously to this success.
