

FY 2017 UPDATE

BY THE NUMBERS

- 69 homes built, 83 families served
- Our annual tithe has built 91 homes around the world
- 206 volunteers contributed 8,401 hours helping with construction, ReStore, and office tasks
- 573 individuals, businesses, and organizations contributed \$434,385 in funds, goods, and services
- Revenue from ReStore operations ensure that 100% of donor contributions are used to build Habitat homes
- Another benefit of ReStore is that we keep useable building materials out of the landfill. For every \$1.00 in ReStore sales 1.3 pounds of materials have been kept out of the landfill
- Over \$300,000 saved by Habitat homeowners through BVHfH interest-free mortgage loans has been invested in businesses, services, and savings in our community

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

- For the 5th year, long-time supporter Cathedral of the Rockies purchased the materials and framed two houses for Habitat for Humanity. The 2017 homes will be located at 46th & Adams
- FarWest Landscape & Garden Center organized and hosted their
 11th annual fundraiser for BVHfH, raising over \$65,000

MISSION STATEMENT

Boise Valley Habitat for Humanity (BVHfH) works in partnership with God and our community to provide decent affordable homes and to promote responsible homeownership for people in need.

We work with families in Ada County earning 30 – 50% of Area Median Income in need of decent, affordable housing. Families selected to participate in our program live in substandard housing, have a stable income, can qualify for a Habitat mortgage, and are willing to complete a requirement of 500 partnership hours, which includes helping construct their own homes.

Building costs are kept low through volunteer labor and financial and in-kind support for obtaining land and materials. Homes are sold to qualified families at no profit and BVHfH carries the zero-interest mortgage. Our building standards assure that we meet or exceed Energy Star standards and use low-VOC materials so that each home provides a healthy environment, is efficient, and has minimal impact on the environment.

46TH & ADAMS

46th & Adams represents the combined efforts and financial support of dedicated organizations and individuals who have selected Habitat for Humanity as a way to give back to their community. Development of this three-home site received generous support from Thrivent Financial, the Wells Fargo Housing Foundation, and First United Methodist Church. In the coming months approximately 500 volunteers will commit 7500 hours to the completion of 46th & Adams. Garden City's Comprehensive Plan cites the need for lower cost housing. Our development addresses this important need with decent, affordable Habitat for Humanity homes.
