

FY 2018 UPDATE

BY THE NUMBERS

- 73 Homes built, 89 families served
- Our annual tithe has built 91 homes around the world
- 329 volunteers contributed 7,324 hours helping with construction, ReStore, and office tasks
- Over 500 individuals, businesses, and organizations contributed \$459,613 in funds, goods, and services
- Profits from ReStore operations ensure that 100% of donor contributions are used to build Habitat homes
- Another benefit of ReStore is that we keep useable building materials out of the landfill. For every \$1.00 in ReStore sales 1.3 pounds of materials have been kept out of the landfill
- Over \$300,000 saved by Habitat homeowners through BVHfH interest-free mortgage loans has been invested in businesses, services, and savings in our community

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

- For the 6th year, long-time supporter Cathedral of the Rockies purchased the materials and framed a house for Habitat for Humanity. The 2018 home is located at Tradewinds subdivision in Meridian
- FarWest Landscape & Garden Center owners Dennis and Maya Fix, along with their team of employees organized and hosted their 12th annual fundraiser for BVHfH, raising over \$39,000

THE HABITAT FOR HUMANITY STORY

Habitat for Humanity International was founded in 1976 in Americus, Georgia when Millard and Linda Fuller decided to do something to give their lives more meaning. The idea that became Habitat grew from their work at a community coop farm where they developed the concept of *Partnership Housing* as a way to address the poverty they saw around them.

Habitat now works in over 1,400 communities in all 50 states and in approximately 70 countries worldwide. It has helped more than **13 million** people achieve stability and independence through safe, decent and affordable shelter.

46TH & ADAMS

46th & Adams represents the combined efforts financial support of dedicated organizations and individuals who have selected Habitat for Humanity as a way to give back to their community. Development of this three-home site received generous support from Citi Foundation, Bank of America, Scentsy, Thrivent Financial, Wells Fargo Housing Foundation, and Cathedral of the Rockies. Approximately 300 volunteers committed over 5,000 hours to the completion of 46th & Adams. Garden City's Comprehensive Plan cites the need for lower cost housing. Our development addresses this important need with decent, affordable Habitat for Humanity homes.
